Wonderfully Made Primary Education



Goals, Christian values and guiding principles

The main message of *Wonderfully Made* is that each child is wonderfully made and worthwhile, no matter what he or she feels, experiences or does. Every child is created by God. Every child is worthy of being known, loved and protected.

The table below describes the four **guiding themes** along with the main goals or final objectives the lessons are working towards. Eight **Christian principles** are also mentioned. These reflect the **value-based approach**. Two Christian values are mentioned to each guiding theme.

Guiding themes	Goals	Christian principle
1. Developing of self- image and self- esteem	Students value themselves, also as a relational and sexual being, from the values of dignity and wonder towards the Creator.	 God created each person (man and woman) as a spiritual, physical, emotional, social and sexual being, valuable from the beginning. Being created by God leads to an attitude of wonder towards the Creator and acknowledging every ones dignity.
2. Promoting sustainable and lasting relationships	Students can recognize, appreciate and build sustainable/lasting relationships with different forms of intimacy, based on the values of love and faithfulness .	 Every person is created by God to participate in relationships with other people (friends, family, church, community) to support each other faithfully, enjoy intimacy in many forms and feel connected, valued and loved. Sexual intercourse can prosper within a, sustainable relationship (marriage) between a man and a woman, embedded in love and faithfulness.
3. Learning social norms	Students can understand various social norms in dealing with relationships and sexuality and can set and articulate their own boundaries, based on the values of respect and responsibility .	 Being created by God leads to an attitude of care and respect for your own private body and for the boundaries of others. Out of Gods great commandments (loving the Lord your God and your neighbour as yourself) comes an attitude of kindness and care towards all other people, regardless sex, gender, race, religion or sexual orientation.
4. Developing protective behaviours	Students are equipped to recognize suspicious and harmful situations and ask for help if necessary, based on the values of self-control and courage .	 The Bible shows the importance of a clean mind and body which requires self-control. Sexual abuse, as well as abuse in general, is wrong, immoral and illegal. Saying no, fleeing and telling about it is the right thing to do.



Structure



The lesson objectives per lesson focus on knowledge, skills and attitudes. Moreover, each lesson is linked to one or two guiding themes of the method (self-image, sustainable relationships, social norms or resilience), see the graphic below. Eight Christian principles are also mentioned. These reflect the value-based approach.

Schools are free to present a certain topic at to a different age group than the table presents.
